La Región de Murcia ha participado junto a unos 80 representantes de diferentes regiones europeas en la conferencia del [proyecto europeo 'Cherries'](#), 'Ecosistemas responsables de salud', celebrada en Bruselas en el marco de la Investigación e Innovación Responsable (RRI, en sus siglas en inglés), que persigue una ciencia más abierta, colaborativa e inclusiva, reduciendo la brecha existente entre el ámbito científico y la sociedad. Esta metodología se ha desarrollado mediante **tres proyectos pilotos de implantación de políticas de RRI en tres territorios europeos**: la Región de Murcia, Örebro (Suecia) y la República de Chipre.

DISSEMINATION AND EXPLOITATION STRATEGY FOR HORIZON EUROPE

Towards an integrated
dissemination & exploitation ecosystem

March 2022

Background

Horizon 2020¹ supported more than 35 000 Research and Innovation projects with direct impact on our society, environment and economy. Many led to concrete breakthroughs, providing solutions both to long-lasting societal challenges and to sudden emergencies like the COVID-19 pandemic. To further support framework programme beneficiaries to take their results a step further –be it for market uptake, wider scientific use or advice for policymaking– the European Commission designed and is implementing a Dissemination and Exploitation Strategy, by:

- offering tailor-made support services ([Horizon Results Booster](#));
- providing the tools aimed at increasing visibility and recognition of successful results ([Horizon Results Platform](#), [Horizon Impact Award](#), [CORDIS](#));
- putting forward a Commission-wide scheme to collect and utilise results relevant to policy making (Feedback to Policy framework).

Vision and mission



After a revision in 2020, the Strategy now meets the novelties of Horizon Europe² and integrates lessons learnt from Horizon 2020. In line with the new [European Research Area](#), it sets the vision of making Horizon Europe a global reference for transforming Research & Innovation results into scientific, economic and societal value. Its mission is to accompany Framework Programme beneficiaries along their Dissemination & Exploitation journey, to further support them through an integrated ecosystem of Dissemination & Exploitation services, and to bring them closer to relevant stakeholders. Inputs collected from the large consultation process for the [implementation](#) of Horizon Europe have further shaped the Strategy. This inclusive approach will be maintained throughout the operational lifetime of the Strategy.

¹ [Horizon 2020](#) was the EU's Research and Innovation Framework Programme running from 2014 until 2020 with a budget of nearly EUR 80 billion. It focused on three key areas: excellent science, industrial leadership and societal challenges. The goal was to ensure that Europe produces world-class science and technology that drives economic growth.

² [Horizon Europe](#) is the EU's Framework Programme for Research and Innovation with a [budget of EUR 95.5 billion](#) for 2021-2027 aiming to strengthen Europe's scientific and technological bases and deliver scientific, technological, economic, environmental and societal impact. It is divided into four pillars: excellent science, global challenges and industrial competitiveness, innovative Europe, as well as widening participation and strengthening the European Research Area.

Objectives and related activities

The objectives of the Strategy with its integrated Dissemination & Exploitation ecosystem:



Guide and Train applicants and beneficiaries by offering dissemination & exploitation capacity building activities.

New [guidance](#) documents and dedicated [trainings](#) have been created to inform and empower the stakeholders concerned with Dissemination & Exploitation requirements at proposal, reporting and post-grant stages.



Motivate beneficiaries with incentives to scale up their results.

Initiatives and opportunities, such as the [Horizon Impact Award](#) contest will continue to inspire beneficiaries to maximise the impact of their research by celebrating individuals or teams that have used their research results to provide value for society.

Support beneficiaries by offering targeted Dissemination & Exploitation services, including on Intellectual Property management.



The [Horizon Results Booster](#) offers professional and customised go-to-market support, advice & training on business plan development. It further increases the added value of Research & Innovation projects by clustering together similar or complementary project results. In addition, the [Horizon Results Platform](#) provides support for innovators through increased visibility, opportunities to attend pitching events and by partnering with networks of investors.



Synergise with other EU programmes and initiatives.

The [Horizon Results Platform](#) has expanded its scope and brings beneficiaries even closer to investors and policy makers. The [HRP TV](#) hosts a series of interviews with experts who guide beneficiaries in their exploitation endeavours and with researchers who became entrepreneurs to inspire other researchers on the same path. A new [synergies tool](#) for Horizon 2020 and Interreg programmes will also enable the creation of novel and blended research and regional partnerships.

Closer to Framework Programme beneficiaries

As the Strategy aims to bring beneficiaries closer to end-users or to third parties who can foster the project results, the focus will henceforth be on ensuring regular exchanges with external stakeholders. This is a key prerequisite for putting the Dissemination and Exploitation 'ecosystem' into full action.
