Los investigadores principales del [proyecto europeo NANEMIAR](#) (Ana Belén Pérez-Oliva, FFIS-IMIB España, Christophe Lachaud, CNRS Francia y Jenny van Asbeck-van der Wijst, MERCURNA Holanda) participaron el pasado día 14/03/2024 en la reunión del RD clúster en Bruselas, una gran iniciativa de la Comisión Europea (CE). **Este clúster reúne los proyectos centrados en el desarrollo de nuevas terapias para enfermedades raras**, todos ellos financiados por la CE bajo la misma convocatoria.

Además de la presentación de NANEMIAR por parte de la IP coordinadora Ana Belén Pérez-Oliva, los socios del proyecto tuvieron la oportunidad de interactuar con el personal investigador del clúster, intercambiar las ideas y establecer sinergias con otros proyectos e iniciativas europeas relevantes.

Murcia acoge la 3ª reunión internacional de la Acción COST



Durante los días **21 y 22/03/2024** acogió Murcia la 3ª reunión internacional de la [Acción COST PRESTO](#), centrada en los receptores P2X como oportunidad terapéutica. Esta Acción COST cuenta con un equipo fuerte y diverso que está trabajando para avanzar en la investigación y lograr sus objetivos, ya que reúne 167 miembros de 28 países diferentes.

En su 3ª reunión internacional, organizada por el personal investigador del IMIB participante en la COST PRESTO, 60 miembros compartieron su experiencia a través de diversas sesiones de conferencias, examinando la implicación de los P2XR en el mecanismo molecular de la inflamación, en el cáncer y enfermedades metabólicas, entre otros.

The second STRATEGIC PLAN 2025-2027 sets direction to the future of R&I

March 2024

The second Horizon Europe strategic plan will steer research and innovation funding within and beyond Europe, to tackle the key global challenges such as climate change, pollution and loss of biodiversity, the digital transition and an ageing population.

From fundamental research to breakthrough innovation and deployment of innovative solutions, the strategic plan directs investments into the **green** and **digital transition**, building a **more resilient, competitive, democratic and inclusive Europe**.

To ensure it is fit for purpose, the strategic plan has been developed together with the Member States, Associated Countries and the European Parliament through extensive exchanges including a large public consultation and a citizens' engagement event. The key strategic orientations mirror the political priorities of the European Union and outline the way research and innovation can address them through Horizon Europe. **Open strategic autonomy and securing Europe's leading role in developing and deploying critical technologies are overarching principles** that apply across all three key strategic orientations.

TARGETS ON CLIMATE, BIODIVERSITY AND DIGITAL EXPENDITURE

The strategic plan raises the ambition and commits to reach the target of 10% of the Horizon Europe's total budget 2025-2027 dedicated to biodiversity-related topics across all pillars. This new commitment complements existing targets for climate expenditure (35% over the lifetime of Horizon Europe) and main digital activities (EUR 13 billion over the same period).

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

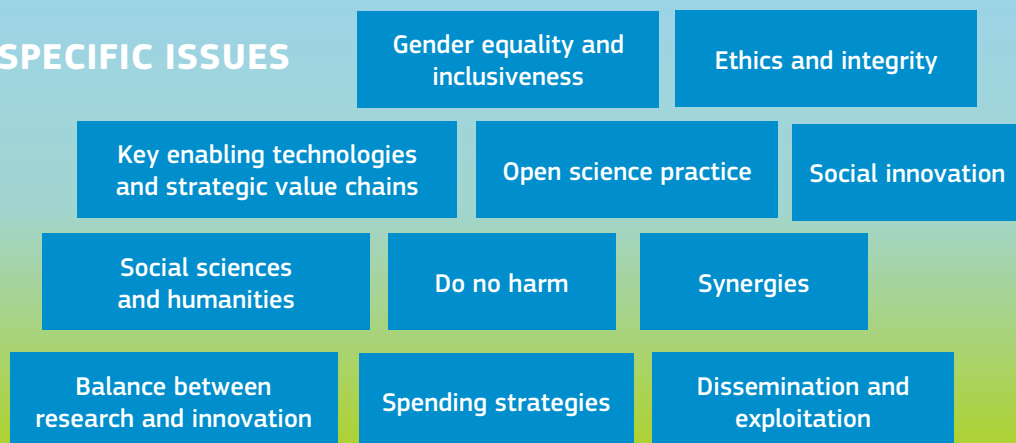
The EU is committed to preserve openness in international cooperation, while safeguarding the Union's strategic interests based on reciprocity and respect of fundamental values and principles. International cooperation takes various approaches, including further association agreements with eligible third countries, international mobility and cooperation in frontier research and EU participation and leadership in multilateral alliances.

RESEARCH SECURITY

Improving research security is key to protecting the EU's open strategic autonomy by ensuring a systematic use of the existing tools and identifying and addressing any remaining gaps. Therefore, the strategic plan highlights the existing measures under Horizon Europe that aim at safeguarding the Union's interests, autonomy and security and will be put in place where necessary to mitigate risks related to research security and technology leakage.



SPECIFIC ISSUES



MISSIONS

- EU Missions are flagships of Horizon Europe. Their aim is to channel efforts across programmes to support well-defined, urgent and bold global challenges with engagement and support of policymakers, stakeholders and the wider public.
- In 2021, five EU Missions were launched: **Adaptation to Climate Change; Cancer; Restore our Ocean and Waters; Climate-Neutral and Smart Cities; and a Soil Deal for Europe.** In 2025–2027, more work will be done to ensure that missions successfully shift from their initial phase to deployment and impact.
